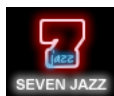

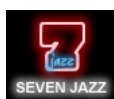
12/06/09 LIMA : Mike Hurley /Paul Hession Friday, 8.30pm £5/ £ 4 conc

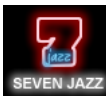
25/06/09 SAA-UK : Pete Locket Thursday, 7.30pm £9/£7conc /£5 NUS Students /£20 group of 4.

Viva Zapatero! is a documentary by Sabina Guzzanti telling her side of the story regarding the conflict with Silvio Berlusconi over a late-night TV political satire show broadcast on RAI-3. The TV broadcasting of the satirical program RAIot was censored in November 2003 after the comedienne, Sabina Guzzanti, made outspoken criticism of the Berlusconi media empire.
