The Journey is a what-if drama about the extraordinary rapprochement between two old enemies – the DUP’s Ian Paisley and Sinn Féin’s Martin McGuinness, set within the Northern Ireland peace process. The film imagines that Paisley had to make a long car journey to get to his 50th wedding anniversary party and for reasons of diplomatic protocol, McGuinness would have to join him : a literal and figurative journey during which the ice would break. *1h 34min. Paterson is a bus driver in the city of Paterson, New Jersey—they share the name.
